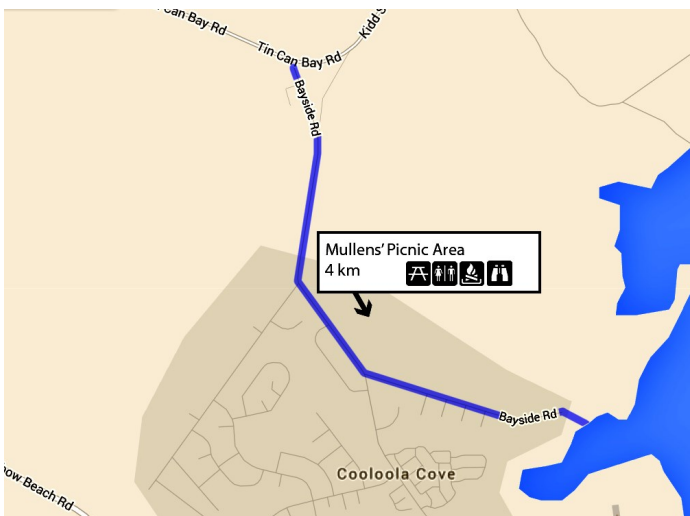
About “Mullens’ Creek Park & Cooloola Foreshores”
