Active, noisy, and aggressive. Sexes similar, grey to dark brown with yellow edges on wings. Yellowish throat, scalloped brown.

Bird Size - 18-21cm.

Food - Insects and nectar.

Nest style - Deep cup.

Material used - Grass and rootlets.

Nest Site - Horizontal fork, 60cm above water. Usually in mangroves that are standing in or near water.

Breeding Season & Details - August-December, also April-May, laying two eggs.

Habits - Feeds in mangroves and along foreshores, may enter well vegetated gardens. Reputedly the best singers of the Honeyeaters. In pairs or small flocks, with constant chattering and chasing.
