Small attractive wader, breeding in Australia. Male has a foxred cap edged black, with a black eye stripe, white breast and grey-brown upperparts. Female similar, with crown duller and less distinct markings.

Bird Size - 14-16cm.

**Food** - Insects, worms and mollusc.

**Nest style** - Ground scrape in soil or sand.

**Material used** - Lined with shells, stones and plants.

**Nest Site** - Next to tidal debris on sandy hillock near seashore, bordering salt mashes on inland lakes.

**Breeding Season & Details** - September to January, laying 2-3 eggs. Both parents incubate and care for young.

**Habits** - Sedentary, nomadic and wide spread throughout Australia. Single, pairs and loose colonies at roosting sites. Feeds along waters edge, runs in spurts ahead of the observer, freezes and bobs head.
