## Local Status - Uncommon

They make "larders" of prey impaled on thorns or sharp twigs.

Bird Size - 28 - 32cm

Food - Insects, small reptiles, birds & field-mice

Nest style - Cup shaped

**Material used** - Twigs, rootlets & vine tendrils lined with dry grass.

**Nest Site** - Two to ten metres from ground, in the upright fork of a tree.

**Breeding Season & Details** - July to January with three to rarely five eggs laid once or twice a year

**Habits** - Generally in pairs or small family groups, inhabiting more open forest & woodland. Immatures help to rare nestlings before leaving the family group.
