Another inhabitant of farmyards and urban areas. Looks quite spectacular and dapper with it's fine upright crest, red eye ring and bronze wing sheen. Flying with a distinct whistle of wings, they are often seen perched on telephone lines. An alternative name often used is "Topknot Pigeon", causing confusion with the Topknot Fruit Pigeon.

**Bird Size** - 31-35cm.

Food - Seeds.

**Nest style** - A frail platform.

Material used - Dry sticks & twigs.

**Nest Site** - Usually in the fork a tree to heights of ten metres or more.

**Breeding Season & Details** - In any season, but usually in the spring & summer months, with two eggs laid once or more a year.

**Habits** - It has a soft "whoo - whoo" call, feeds on the ground in pairs or small flocks, and occupies a range of habitats, except heavy forests. Prefers open ground for feeding and has benefited greatly from man's clearing activities.
