Local Status – Uncommon

As the name states this bird has a yellow bill, and is not as common in our region as the black-billed and slightly smaller Royal Spoonbill.

Bird Size - 76-90cm

Food - Aquatic insects, also eating crustaceans, fish and molluses.

Nest style - Platform, (as per Royal Spoonbill).

Material used - Sturdy sticks, (as per Royal Spoonbill).

Nest Site - On reeds, bushes and trees, (as per Royal Spoonbill).

Breeding Season & Details - September to April, laying up to four eggs and returning to same breeding area each year, (similar to Royal Spoonbill).

Habits - Also similar to the Royal Spoonbill, but tending to be more wary in it's feeding and roosting habits.
